Meet the team

In Spring 2018 the idea came up to start an organization to grant micro loans in the area of Arusha, Tanzania. From this idea, Pamoja Nguvu was born: a project that stimulates and actively helps underprivileged women, and young adults graduating from Happy Watoto Tanzanian Homes and Schools to become economically sustainable, successful and independent. By granting micro loans they can start small businesses and become financially stable.

How we work

Pamoja Nguvu is an independent organization founded by Matti Emondts, co-founder of Happy Watoto, Monique Emondts and Jacqueline de Bruijn. Together with Fred Arp, also treasurer of Happy Watoto, they form the board of Pamoja Nguvu. To keep overhead costs as low as possible, Pamoja Nguvu uses the infrastructure of Happy Watoto Tanzanian Homes and Schools. Funds are completely separated, all donations for Pamoja Nguvu will be put into loans completely.

The reason we started Pamoja Nguvu is Mama Lulu. With \$100 she started her aspired banana business and within a few months she was able to move into a stone house. Now she has made a down payment on a piece of land and is saving to build a house. This totally changed Mama Lulu's life. Apart from having no financial worries anymore, she enjoys life, her children can go to school and have a happy mom.

First field research in Arusha

In November we, the Dutch team, went to Arusha for a kick off together with the Tanzanian team. During this stay, we agreed on the way of working and procedures that are now ready to be tested with the first group of women and students. The criteria for admittance were set and the training has been developed. We also learned that the biggest threat for sustainable economic success, is that family or ex husbands move in to take advantage of the improved situation and that thieves lurk to steel cash. To diminish these risks, we want to be sure to build a strong network and teach the women and students about these risks during the training. In addition, everyone with a micro loan will have their own bank account so there is no need for cash money.
